President's Message

We are all aware that we are living in a different world now. President Abraham Lincoln observed during a challenging era nearly 150 years ago, "The dogmas of the quiet past are inadequate to the stormy present. The occasion is piled high with difficulty, and we must rise with the occasion. As our case is new, so we think anew and act anew."

Beyond September 11th

There is no question that the events of September 11, 2001 have changed our environment and how as transportation professionals we will need to respond. As government takes the appropriate actions in the interest of national security, it is also time for us to react. We must consider how we can plan and engineer transportation systems to be more secured, to provide a more durable and safe environment for people, and to provide safe and rapid egress. Legislative and fiscal priorities will change, and they will affect transportation programs and improvements. We need to be aware that investment in transportation infrastructure creates economic benefit, both in the short term as a result of design and construction activity and in the long term through improved access and mobility. And, efficient transportation system operations will be more important. The profession will rise to the challenge.

TEA 21 Reauthorization

During the next two years, the transportation profession will be faced and challenged with the authorization of new federal surface transportation programs. The Transportation Equity Act for the 21st Century (TEA-21), passed in 1998, authorizes the USDOT programs of the Federal Highway Administration, Federal Transit Administration and others through September 30, 2003. ARTBA in its

recent report to Congress stated the need to reauthorize TEA-21 to meet national infrastructure needs; and, to maintain the current infrastructure condition would require an annual Federal transportation budget of approximately \$50B. However, with the current needs in security, defense and social programs, it seems clear that this level or any increase might be hard to attain. There will be challenges ahead to expand transportation funding and programs for the construction, maintenance and operation of the needed federal, state and local transportation improvements. All of us will have to rise to this formidable task.

Section and Institute Affairs

The Section has a few activities underway during this busy time where your action and participation are needed:

The nominating committee, headed by Vice-President **Dawn Marincic**, has created an excellent slate of Officers and Directors to lead the Section in 2002. The slate warrants your support. The ballots have been mailed. Please fill out your ballot and return it quickly so that the results of the election can be announced at the Section's December luncheon meeting.

The Section December luncheon will be held at Maggiano's in Chicago on Thursday, December 20, 2001. Mr. Earl Newman, ITE District IV Director, will report on the ITE's activities and new programs. Contact is **Maynard Abuan** at (630) 773-3900.

The Activities Group is working hard to set up the next Annual Dinner Meeting in January 2002. A postcard announcing the location and date will be mailed to you. If last year's dinner meeting can be used as an example

Legislative Issues

National

Since September 11, 2001, a bill was introduced that would establish the Federal Emergency Transportation Administration (FETA) within the U.S. Department of Transportation (U.S. DOT). FETA would be responsible for coordinating domestic transportation during a national emergency, including aviation, maritime and port security, and surface transportation, including rail. During a national emergency, FETA would coordinate national transportation and transportation-related activities of all federal agencies, disseminate critical transportation-related information, develop and notify appropriate federal, state and local authorities of uniform emergency transportation security standards to be followed during an n emergency and to ensure those standards are followed. H.R. 2950 was introduced in the House of Representatives as The Rail Infrastructure Development and Expansion Act for the 21st Century. The bill authorizes \$71 billion for railroad infrastructure expansion and improvements that include high speed rail, freight and commuter rail improvements, including short lines, and corridor planning and technology development. The House Transportation and Infrastructure Subcommittee on Highways and Transit held a hearing entitled "TEA-21 Success Stories," to learn from local and private sector professionals about success stories of surface transportation projects under TEA-21 and the governments role in that process. With the current national economic situation, Committee members anticipate efforts to reduce guaranteed funding levels and pressure to raid the Highway Trust Fund to offset general fund expenditures. As such, this meeting was also an opportunity to shore up support for the core principals of TEA-21.

State of Illinois

House Bill 0418 amends the Toll Highway Act. It provides that the Illinois State Toll Highway Authority may not enter into any agreement or understanding for the use or acquisition of land that is intended to be used or acquired for toll highway purposes unless full disclosure of all individuals and entities holding any beneficial interest in the land is made. Provides that if the Authority commences condemnations proceedings to acquire land for a toll highway, holders of all beneficial interests must make full disclosure, unless the court determines that disclosure would cause one or more of them irreparable harm. House Bill 0180 amends the Illinois Vehicle Code and the Unified Code of Corrections. It provides that upon approaching an authorized emergency vehicle with oscillating, rotating, or flashing lights while the operator is performing official duties, a person who drives an approaching vehicle shall yield the right of way by making a lane change if it is safe to do so or shall reduce speed and proceed with caution if a lane change would be impossible or unsafe. A fine of up to \$10,000 could occur for a violation. The bill was adopted and is now Public Act 92-0283. A copy of the Act is available at:

House Bill 0604 amends the Environmental Protection Act. It requires the Environmental Protection Agency to propose rules concerning the water quality impact for facility planning area enlargements. It changes the Agency's consideration of local and regional comprehensive plans to consideration of local, county, and regional land use plans. The bill has been referred to the Rules Committee and a copy of the bill is available at:

Transportation Planning Committee Seeking Help

The section Transportation Planning Committee is initiating the development of a "living bibliography" covering transportation planning documents, initially focusing on the Chicago area. The committee is about to solicit basic information on transportation planning studies covering title and author(s), mode(s), an abstract, status and contact. Studies may range from smaller corridor or area studies through metrowide reviews. The collected information will then be input to an Access database, making it "searchable" by any relevant query criteria, and some or all of the database will be posted on the section Web site. The idea is to add new reports over time, making the database a ready reference for section members in any project needing related planning information. Depending on the response and overall interest, the geographic coverage may be expanded to cover other parts of the state as well.

In the initial round, major agencies, counties plus larger cities and municipalities will be surveyed. The list will likely start with CTA, RTA, Metra, Pace, IDOT District 1, all six counties, Chicago, Aurora, Naperville, Schaumburg, Arlington Heights and Joliet as a minimum. It is expected that some of the

surveyed agencies may need a little helpful prodding or assistance. Once responses come in, there will be a need to input the data to the database and run queries and reports.

Sound like an interesting and useful undertaking? The committee soon needs volunteers to help follow-up on the survey responses, and to complete database entry and report preparation. The time frame to receive responses is January 2002, with the aim of placing results on the Web site by springtime. This work will only succeed with the active support and involvement of section members, and the committee is seeking volunteers.


