It is our sad duty to report to you Robert "Bob" Grady, a 1993 President of the Illinois Section of the Institute of Transportation Engineers and a year 2000 recipient of the Illinois Section's Past Presidents Award, passed away on March 10, 2008. Bob's years of service to our Section were greatly appreciated and he will be missed.

Mr. Grady's most recent position was as a Senior Transportation Planner with T.Y. Lin International (TYLI) where he was responsible for a variety of traffic and transit planning projects. Prior to joining TYLI, Bob had 26 years of transportation planning and management experience with the Chicago Transit Authority (CTA).

Bob's career in traffic engineering and operations planning was highlighted by planning and managing the shuttle bus network of 11 routes serving 53 hotels and 16,000 delegates to the 1996 Democratic National Convention in Chicago, Illinois. His broad-based experience has included transit operations planning, program development, passenger information and operational graphic design, construction oversight, interagency relations, and policy level management.

Bob is survived by his wife Diane, his daughter Carrie and son Michael.

Our region and agency have an opportunity to look beyond the ways in which we have traditionally addressed quality-of-life issues. We need to bring different ideas and different people to the table as we look at the future of northeastern Illinois and the challenges that we face. Also, please read and comment on our new strategy report on brownfields, which the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency defines as "abandoned, idled, or under-used industrial and commercial facilities where expansion or redevelopment is complicated by real or perceived environmental contamination." Our report describes the multiple layers of benefits – economic, environment, and social – that

brownfield redevelopment can offer the region.

City of the Year. Congratulations are once again in order for the City of Chicago, which has been named 2008 U.S. City of the Year in the June issue Fast Company magazine. According to Fast Company, "The real Chicago isn't so easy to keep up with. It's constantly reinventing itself . . . But what any Chicagoan will also tell you is that the past is very much present. It doesn't go away. It shouldn't. In fact, that's Chicago's lure and its beauty: its ability to take what was and figure out what could be." Be sure to see the magazine's slide show of "Five Things You Don't Know About Chicago," one of which is that 29 percent of downtown Chicago residents have graduate degrees, which is 3.3 times the national average. US CONGRESS CONSIDERS COMPLETE STREETS

COMPLETE STREETS

In early May, Rep. Doris Matsui (D-Calif.) introduced the "Safe and Complete Streets Act of 2008." This bill would require states that receive federal funding for their road improvement projects to implement complete streets policies. These policies ensure that any new road construction or rehabilitation efforts would accommodate the safety and convenience of all

users of the transportation system. In March, Sen. Tom Harkin (D-Iowa) introduced similar legislation (S. 2686). Both pieces of legislation ensure that future transportation investments create appropriate and safe transportation facilities for all those using the road: motorists, transit vehicles and riders, bicyclists, and pedestrians of all ages and abilities.
