CHICAGO PEDESTRIAN SAFETY CAMPAIGN

October 25, 2011, Chicago IL. The Chicago Department of Transportation, in partnership with the Chicago Police Department and the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration, today launched a citywide pedestrian safety campaign aimed at reducing pedestrian crashes and fatalities.

The campaign kicked off with an installation of 32 mannequins along Wacker Drive, each one representing one of the 32 pedestrians killed in Chicago crashes in 2010.

"Pedestrians are the most vulnerable users of the public way," said CDOT Commissioner Gabe Klein. "This campaign is specifically designed to change the behaviors that lead to pedestrian crashes."

Klein was joined by representatives of the Chicago Police Department, IDOT and the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration, which provided funding for the campaign. In addition to the Wacker Drive installation, the campaign will include: awareness messages on street furniture (bus shelters, info panels, trash receptacles, etc.) and direct outreach to schools, senior facilities, and taxi drivers. CDOT will also install small crossing flags at key neighborhood locations, and stencilling pedestrian safety messages on sidewalks in high traffic areas around the city.

CDOT and the Chicago Police Department will also continue their successful crosswalk-enforcement initiatives, aimed at getting more drivers to stop for pedestrians in crosswalks.

"Chicago deserves kudos for its highly creative campaign to raise awareness of pedestrian safety," said Administrator David Strickland of the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration. "All over America, local jurisdictions are launching

innovative initiatives to protect pedestrians, including stepped-up enforcement and improvements to roadway infrastructures. NHTSA strongly supports these vitally important measures."

In 2010, there were just under 3,000 crashes involving pedestrians. While pedestrian injuries and fatalities in Chicago have declined in the last several years, the city is committed to making Chicago the safest in the country, Klein said. Klein said CDOT's goal is to reduce the number of pedestrian fatalities to zero by 2020.

This campaign and the coordinated enforcements are one of several efforts to improve safety and are based on a recent Pedestrian Crash Analysis released by CDOT. The analysis informed the messaging of this campaign and is being utilized in the development of the Chicago Pedestrian Plan (www.chicagopedestrianplan.org) and ongoing infrastructure improvements throughout the city.

The campaign and the enforcements are funded by a grant awarded by the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA). NHTSA awarded funds to three state agencies and the City of Chicago to promote coordinated pedestrian safety education and enforcement efforts around the country.





VALPARAISO UNIVERSITY DEDICATES DONALD V. FITES ENGINEERING INNOVATION CENTER

Leaders at Valparaiso University joined with community members to dedicate the \$13 million Donald V. Fites Engineering Innovation Center, a state of the art addition to the current Gellersen Engineering and Mathematics Center, in a ceremony that took place at noon on Saturday, Oct. 29, 2011.

The new facility covers 13,470 square feet, and is made up primarily of laboratory and learning space for undergraduate engineering students. The project also includes a renovation of about 4,300 square feet of existing laboratory facilities.

The new building is named after Donald V. Fites '56 CE, who is the retired Chief Executive Officer and Chairman of Caterpillar Inc. and a member of the Valparaiso University Board of Directors.

"Mr. Fites is one of the Valparaiso University's College of Engineering's most successful graduates, and is someone our engineering alumni and the University community greatly respect," said Kraig Olejniczak, dean of the College of Engineering. "He has played a significant role in our past fundraising campaigns and is a major financial supporter of the College of Engineering. We are proud to honor the legacy of Mr. Fites with this new building."

The Fites Center includes two suites of labs designed to support advanced student research. One suite has labs for Materials Science, Materials Engineering and Structural Engineering. The second suite is the Energy Systems Suite, which includes the Engine Test Cell, Mechanical Measurements Lab, Fluid Mechanics Lab and Small Engines Lab. Caterpillar Inc. has donated hightech engines for student research.

"My hope is that this facility will provide these engineering students a high-quality facility that will help create an educational experience that mirrors what they will be facing in the real world, providing them a foundation from which they will be better prepared to solve the future engineering challenges in the workplace," said Fites.

One of the College of Engineering's primary goals is to guide students in their transition from high school students when they enter the program to professionals when they graduate. The Senior Design space within the Fites Center is set up to mimic a professional office setting.

"Each senior student has his or her own work space and their daily routine is much closer to a professional workday than an academic schedule," said Olejniczak. "This environment also fosters collaboration between all three disciplines in the engineering college."

UNIVERSITY OF ILLINOIS CEE ONLINE MASTERS

Starting in August 2011, the University of Illinois Department of Civil and Environmental Engineering began offering its Master of Science degree program to online students (CEE Online). Students can currently choose specialization in Construction Management, Transportation Engineering, or Infrastructure, and courses offered online represent all seven areas of civil and environmental engineering. The online program was developed in response to student demand and as part of CEE's commitment to lifelong learning and access to education. An interdisciplinary team of civil engineering faculty members developed the management plan, discussed and finalized pedagogy, and gathered input from other faculty regarding implementation of the program. The College of Engineering provides IT support for CEE Online, and manages the selection and coordination of proctors to administer exams and quizzes to the online students.

Online students can apply for the master's degree program, work toward certificates, or take individual classes. A Certificate in Environmental and Water Resources Engineering through online classes has been offered for many years, and certificates are planned for courses in railroad engineering and transportation for those professionals wanting clusters of courses, but not the full master's program. Admission requirements for the master's program online are identical to the on-campus requirements. Online students are enrolled in the same courses that are offered on campus. and interact with on-campus students on assignments, projects, and presentations. Oncampus lectures are recorded in state-of-the-art blended learning classrooms on campus and made available to online students within hours of the class meeting. IDOT LIFE-SAVING YELLOW DOT PROGRAM

December 12, 2011, Chicago, IL. The Illinois Department of Transportation today unveiled the Illinois Yellow Dot program, a life-saving, traffic safety initiative that provides first responders with critical information to improve emergency care for persons involved in vehicle crashes. IDOT along with the Illinois Department of Public Health (IDPH), Illinois Department of Aging (IDOA) and county health departments across the state are working together to increase awareness of the voluntary, federally funded program, and provide distribution centers and information for interested residents.

"Roadway safety is always a top priority at IDOT, and the Yellow Dot program can help improve roadway safety by providing first responders the crucial medical information they need to treat injuries and save lives, beginning at the scene of a crash," said Acting Transportation Secretary Ann Schneider. "This important program gives IDOT and our partners another important way to improve our exceptional record on traffic safety. I encourage all motorists to participate in this unique and effective program, which could make the difference between life and death for individuals involved in crashes."

Because the first hour following an injury is the most crucial, the Yellow Dot program provides essential personal health information to emergency responders in order to promptly care for a crash victim. This 'Golden Hour' is critical in the treatment of crash victims, and the medical information provided through the program could be a lifesaver.

When a crash occurs, emergency medical first responders such as police officers, firefighters and emergency medical technicians are immediately dispatched to the scene. These responders usually have basic information such as the location of the crash and the number of victims. Frequently, minimal personal information is available during this early, most critical time period.

"This is a great opportunity for older drivers to update their medical information and have a voice in their emergency treatment in the event of an accident," said John K. Holton, Ph.D., director of the Illinois Department on Aging. "The Yellow Dot program will serve as a lifeline to alert first responders of crucial medical information which can help the victims who may be unable to communicate at the crash site or may have forgotten to share the information." Yellow Dot participants are supplied with a simple, bright yellow decal for their car and a corresponding yellow folder. The decal is placed in a conspicuous and consistent place - in the lower left-hand corner of the rear window, driver's side. The yellow dot signifies there is a folder in the glove compartment containing the following medical information about the motorists: participant's name, close-up photo, emergency contact information, patient's physician information, medical conditions, recent surgeries, allergies and a list of current medications. Having access to this information allows first responders to make important decisions regarding emergency treatment and can better prepare emergency hospital staff in the receiving room.


"Time is critical in an emergency situation. If paramedics and emergency medical workers know what medications a person is taking, if the person has allergies or a chronic condition, they can make better decisions about treatment," said Acting IDPH Director Dr. Craig Conover. "Delaying treatment can mean the difference between life and death in some cases. Something as simple as having your medical information on a yellow card in your glove compartment can potentially make a big difference in the emergency care you receive."

The Yellow Dot program, funded by the U.S. Department of Transportation, was originally introduced in Connecticut in 2002. For more information on the program and to find a distribution center near you, visit www.yellowdotillinois.org.

CONGRESSMAN COSTELLO TO Retire

October 24, 2011, Washington DC. U.S. Congressman Jerry Costello (D-IL) announced today that he will not be a candidate for re-election to Congress in 2012.

Costello emphasized that he will not retire as retirement is not in his DNA. "You can't go from 100 mph everyday and just stop - I intend to continue to go full speed pursuing other interests and opportunities that may come along."

Costello, a key Democrat on the House Transportation and Infrastructure Committee, said that he was proud of his record in Congress - in particular his work improving the transportation network of Southwestern and Southern Illinois. Costello intends to complete his current term of office ending in January, 2013.


