AWARDS NOMINATIONS SOUGHT

PRESIDENTS' AWARD

The ITE Past Presidents' Award for Merit in Transportation is awarded annually for a paper reporting on independent and original research or on an outstanding accomplishment in the field of transportation engineering. The purpose of the Award is to recognize distinguished achievement in transportation engineering by younger members of the Institute. **ELIGIBILITY:** To be an eligible recipient for the proposed award, a candidate must be a non-student member of the Institute who has not reached his/her 35th birthday by April 1st of the award year.

• The candidate must have conducted or been a principal participant in an original study or project in the field of transportation.

- The study or project must have been completed with two (2) years of the stated deadline for entries (April 1).
- The study or project may have been financed with public or private funds by contract.
- The study or project may have been previously reported to another group or publicized in other media.
- The study or project may be an expansion or revision of a paper that previously has been submitted to the Institute in the Past Presidents' Award competition.
- Papers by multiple authors are not eligible for this award.

SUBMITTAL PROCEDURE:

- The candidate will submit an original paper describing the study or project undertaken.
- The paper must be typewritten, double-spaced, and can be no longer than 5,000 words in length.
- The paper must be accompanied by an abstract of not more than 300 words.
- The submission will include a statement clearly indicating the candidate's relationship to the study or project in terms of design, conduct of the work, analysis of data, and authorship of the paper itself.
- Each application must be submitted electronically, in one document, formatted in Adobe Acrobat®.
- Submission must be received at ITE Headquarters office no later than 5:00 pm by the deadline of April 1, 2012. Submit application to: Carol MacDougall <u>cmacdougall@ite.org</u>, Subject Line: Past Presidents' Award

EVALUATION CRITERIA:

- Originality 20%
- Significance 20%
- Scope, format, clarity 20%
- Validity 20%
- Applicability 20%

AWARD: Recognition at the ITE Annual Meeting and in ITE Journal, Inscribed certificate, and Up

to \$1,500 travel reimbursement to attend the ITE Annual Meeting (at which the award will be presented).

ITE PUBLIC AGENCY COUNCIL Award

The purpose of the ITE Public Agency Council Award is to recognize government agencies that achieve excellence. This award is not directed at the technical work of the agency, which may be recognized by such awards as the Transportation Achievement Award or the Transportation Planning Council Awards, but rather at how the agency conducts its business. This award may be given annually.

ELIGIBILITY: Eligibility extends to local governments, regional organizations, state or provincial agencies, and transportation districts and authorities.

SUBMITTAL PROCEDURE: Each entry should be completed by the agency submitting the nomination and contain the following pieces of information:

- Agency information: Agency's name, address, web site listing and name of member submitting the nomination including phone/fax numbers and email address.
- Description of the practice or program being nominated: Must communicate how the management practice or program is specifically related to the agency's ability to deliver outstanding results in the transportation engineering, planning, operations or related activities.
- Supporting Documentation: Additional information may be provided to help describe the practice or program. This may include brochures, manuals, press clippings, photographs, etc. The information must be submitted in sufficient detail to allow objective judging of these efforts.

Each nomination must not exceed ten pages including a cover page with the agency information.

All nominations must be sent to ITE HQ electronically formatted in Adobe Acrobat® no **later than 5:00pm on April 1, 2012** to Tatiana Richey (*Continued on page 7*)

ITE INNOVATIVE INTERMODAL SO-LUTIONS FOR URBAN TRANSPOR-TATION PAPER AWARD

This award has two purposes: to encourage reporting of activities and programs that have been effective in addressing urban transportation needs through the development of innovative, practical and balanced intermodal solutions; and to publicize the role of transportation professionals in achieving innovative solutions to urban transportation needs.

ELIGIBILITY: Any individual transportation professional, member or non-member of ITE, who actively has been involved with and reports on intermodal activity or programs that address urban transportation issues.

For a paper to be eligible, it must be published in the Annual Meeting Compendium, the Technical Conference Compendium, or the ITE Journal.

SUBMITTAL PROCEDURE:

- In order to be considered for this award, each original paper and/or program application must be submitted electronically in one document with this submittal form as page one, formatted in Adobe Acrobat®.
- Please send your PDF submission electronically no later than 5:00 p.m. on April 1, 2012 to Carol MacDougall at <u>cmacdougall@ite.org</u> (Attn:

SELECTION PROCESS: After an initial screening process conducted by session presiders and other volunteers, the subset of potential finalist papers is narrowed down to the 5-8 finalist papers. The finalist papers will be reviewed by a subcommittee of the Transit Council and the winning paper is selected based on the highest score from the judging criteria. The Awards Chair then notifies ITE headquarters by May 1st of the winner.

AWARD: Recognition at the ITE Annual Meeting and in ITE Journal and an award plaque.


