

## 2015 IL Section Election Results

Thank you to the 106 ITE Illinois Section members who participated in the 2015 Election. The ballot included unopposed candidates for the President, Vice President, and Secretary positions; two candidates for Treasurer; five candidates for two open Director positions; and one referendum.

The referendum issue asked members for input on amending Section 6.3 of the Section's Bylaws. Currently, to make any changes to the Bylaws, Section 6.3 dictates that 50% of all members must

vote in an election , with two-thirds voting "Yes" for the proposed change. This year, 24.77% of Illinois Section members voted in the election, illustrating the difficulty of obtaining votes from more than 50% of all members in an election. The referendum asked if the requirement for a majority of

members to vote should be removed. This would mean that amendments to the Bylaws could be passed with a two-thirds affirmative vote on the proposed change, regardless of how many members vote in the election. The election results showed that 90 of you (84.91%) voted "Yes" on the referendum to institute this change to Section 6.3. The Board will consider these results when deciding how to proceed with any future proposed changes to the Section's Bylaws. The Officers for the 2016 Executive Board will be as follows:

The two director candidates obtaining the highest number of votes were Jenna Brose, PE (AECOM) and Monica Shei, EIT (Jacobs). They will join two existing directors on the Board serving the second year of their two-year term: Operations Director Katelyn Bleach, EIT (Jacobs) and Activities Director Sanjay Joshi, PE (STV). As Brian Roberts will be serving as Treasurer in 2016 instead of as the Student Affairs Director for a second year, the Board will appoint a new director to fill his vacant position.

#### Scholarship

The ITE Illinois Section Scholarship Awards are presented annually to one graduate student and one undergraduate student who have demonstrated a strong interest in the transportation field through their coursework, a personal statement, faculty recommendation, and several other criteria. The awards, in the amount of \$2,000 each, are to provide partial financial support to students considering Transportation Engineering or Planning in their future career aspirations.

Graduate students are also provided the opportunity to submit a written paper on a transportation engineering or planning topic for the chance to be awarded \$1,000 in the 2015 ITE Illinois Section Student Paper Award Competition. The student paper award recipient for the Illinois Section is also automatically entered into the Midwest ITE Student Paper Competition.

## ITE, ASCE T&DI, WTS, and ISPE Joint Dinner - Mr. Paul Kovacs -**Chief Engineer for the Illinois Tollway**

On Thursday, November 19th, ITE in conjunction with ASCE T&DI, WTS, and ISPE held a dinner event featuring Mr. Paul Kovacs, P.E. - Chief Engineer for Illinois Tollway.

Mr. Kovacs is responsible for the planning, design, construction, operation and maintenance of the agency's 286-mile system of roadways serving 1.5 million daily users in Northern Illinois. Currently, he is delivering the fourth year of the Illinois Tollway's 15-year, \$12 billion capital program, Move Illinois: The Illinois Tollway Driving the Future. Mr. Kovacs earned his B.S. in Civil Engineering from the University of Illinois and is a registered professional engineer in Illinois and Michigan. In his nearly 30 years of professional engineering experience, 17 were spent in the consulting industry. He joined the Illinois Tollway in 1999 and prior to his appointment to Chief Engineer, he served as the ORT program manager and deputy chief of project implementation. In this role, he managed the conversion of 20 mainline plazas to open road tolling and improvements along the Tri-State (I-94/I-294/I-80), Jane Addams Memorial (I-90) and Reagan Memorial (I- Mr. Paul Kovacs, P.E. - Chief Engineer for 88) tollways.

## A Review of the ITE Webinar: Signal Timing Manual Second Edition By Lina M. Campuzano, Clark Dietz, Inc.

On November 4, the Illinois Section of ITE hosted a Snack and Learn for the ITE Webinar: Signal Timing Manual, Second Edition. The webinar instructors included **Alison Tanaka** from Kittelson & Associates, **Tom Urbanik** from Kittelson & Associates, and **Peter Koonce** from the City of Portland. The webinar was held at the Clark Dietz, Chicago office and the City of Naperville's T.E.D. Department.

The presentation started by explaining the focus of the second edition; present information in a precise and concise manner, the use of graphics and references to improve understanding of the topic, and the addition of four new chapters. The main goal of the second edition of the Signal Timing manual is to best describe the information to a wide variety of users.

The Signal Timing Manual is broken into tree sections:

- Signal timing fundamentals
- Basic signal systems
- Advance systems and applications

After an overview of the signal timing fundamentals, the presenters continued the webinar with examples on Trailing Overlaps and Passage Time, chapters 5-8. The webinar concluded with an overview of chapters 9 thru 12 that corresponds to Advanced Systems and Applications. The presentation did not go into specific details on what tools or standards to use.

The webinar was followed by a discussion of the event attendees on what could be applied from current tools to the projects that each was currently working on. The Technical Group looks forward to doing more viewing in 2016. We want to thank Clark Dietz, Inc. and the City of Naperville who was generous to offer their conference rooms, and all the attendees for participating in the event.

## Move Together Shared Mobility Summit - An Overview By Erik Cempel, Cambridge Systematics, Inc.

What does the term "shared mobility" mean to you? The *Move Together Shared Mobility Summit* hosted by the Chicago-based Shared-Use Mobility Center on September 28-30 helped both clarify and expand that definition for many of us participants. Carsharing services like Zipcar or I-go, ridersharing services like Lyft and Uber, bikesharing entities like Divvy, and even good old-fashioned carpooling come to mind. But many other forms of shared mobility have begun emerging in the market. For example, complementary or supplementary forms of public transit known as "microtransit" fit within shared mobility, and include tech-enabled shuttles, ride-splitting services, and

variations on carpooling, supported by technology that dynamically generates routes based on real-time demand.

The implications of such services on transit were a consistent thread of conversation throughout the conference: how can the industry ensure that these services help, rather than diminish, the goals of public transit? Having industry innovators in the same room as city, county, state, Federal, and transit agency officials; politicians; transportation and environmental justice advocates; consultants; and many others helped to shape that policy discussion on this topic in ways not seen in other transportation forums. A key question for all was how do regions prepare for, facilitate, and, as needed, regulate these emerging services?

Technology developers were the other key foundation of the conference. New hardware, software, data collection, and data analysis allow for the explosion of new shared mobility services, in ways not possible just a few years ago. Attendees and presenters pondered what new transportation services have yet to emerge from the new technological platforms, and what new technologies may emerge in the coming years to allow yet-unimagined forms of mobility?

## Illinois Bike Summit Includes Training on NACTO Urban Bikeway Design Guide

In October, the Illinois Bike Summit brought together engineers, planners, and bicycle professionals for its fourth annual meeting in Champaign, Illinois. Included for the first time as part of this summit was an all-day training on the National Association of City Transportation Officials (NACTO) Urban Bikeway Design Guide (UBDG), hosted by Ride Illinois and Champaign County Bikes. **Nathan Roseberry**, P.E., and **Timothy Gustafson**, AICP, from T.Y. Lin International (TYLI) provided the training session which included a three-part itinerary to introduce 65 participants to the contents of the 2nd edition of the UBDG.

In the morning, T.Y. Lin provided in-class training, where Nate drew upon recent project experience within the City of Chicago to illustrate examples of innovative bike facility designs. Following the classroom portion, Tim and Nate led a bicycle ride and a walking tour to review and discuss existing bicycle facilities in Champaign, and returned to the classroom to lead a design exercise where groups of participants applied their newly obtained knowledge to theoretical design challenges in Urbana and Champaign. The training was well-received and additional sessions are being considered for the Chicagoland region in 2016.

Jeffrey F. Paniati, P.E. Joins ITE as New Executive Director and CEO

Mr. Paniati's career with FHWA comprised a series of progressively more responsible roles, from leading safety and traffic operations research programs at the Turner-Fairbank Highway Research Center, to Director of the Intelligent Transportation Systems (ITS) Joint Program Office, to Associate Administrator of the FHWA Office of Operations. Mr. Paniati served as FHWA's Executive Director from 2008-2015. There he was responsible for 2,900 employees in 65 offices nationwide and an annual operating budget of \$400 million. He was a senior adviser to the FHWA Administrator on programs, policies, and priorities for the \$40 billion annual federal-aid highway program. He led the development and implementation of the highway provisions in the Moving Ahead for Progress in the 21st Century Act (MAP-21) surface transportation program, including the transformative move to a performance-based federal-aid highway program. He was a champion for FHWA's efforts to create more livable communities, better accommodate pedestrians and bicycles, and create more flexible design approaches through performance-based practical design and context sensitive solutions.

Under Mr. Paniati's leadership, FHWA was recognized as a Top 5 Best Place to Work (out of 300 peer federal agencies) by the Partnership for Public Service. Mr. Paniati also represents the United States as the first delegate to the World Road Association, where he serves as the Chair of the Strategic Planning Commission.

Mr. Paniati has received numerous performance and honor awards. He is a recipient of the Secretary's gold medal and the Secretary's Award for Meritorious Achievement. In 2010 he was recognized with the prestigious Presidential Rank Award of Distinguished Executive for exceptional long-term accomplishments and commitment to excellence in public service. In 2011 he was inducted into the University of Connecticut Academy of Distinguished Engineers and Hall of Fame.

As an ITE member for more than 25 years and a Fellow of ITE, Mr. Paniati has served as President of the ITE Washington, DC Section and as Chair of the Traffic Engineering Council. He has a bachelor's degree in civil engineering from the University of Connecticut and a master's degree in civil engineering from the University of Maryland.






