The Illinois Section has stayed busy with several great events over the last few months, including a presentation from IDOT and CDOT about the North Lake Shore Drive project, a Traffic Signal Operations Technical Workshop in August, and an update on IDOT's roundabouts program in October. We also cohosted two events with our friends at WTS: our annual golf outing on August 18 and an End of Summer Social at the Hofbräuhaus in Rosemont on September 29.

I love exploring new places and meeting new people, so two of the highlights of the summer for me were attending the Midwestern District Conference in Madison and the ITE International Conference in Toronto. I've been to Madison a few times in the past, but I had a blast exploring more of the City on a bike tour and by competing in (and winning) the "MiteY Race," a combination of a scavenger hunt and trivia contest where several teams raced between different stations scattered throughout the compact and walkable downtown. It was a lot of fun, and a great way to get

Smart Cities, autonomous and connected vehicles, and technology were hot topics at both conferences. One of my favorite technical presentations in Madison was called Understanding and Improving Multi-modal Travel with Big Data. Vendors such as Airsage, Teralytics, and Streetlight all offer data sets that can allow us to improve our understanding of travel patterns when working on various projects.

There were just a few of us from the Illinois Section among the 1,300 attendees in Toronto, but it was great tosee many others from the Midwestern District as well as familiar faces such as former Illinois Section Board Members Chris DeRosia (now in Colorado) and Tracy Shandor (now in Georgia). In Toronto, I particularly enjoyed the Tuesday "Power Lunch" with Dr. John Leonard, who is a professor at MIT researching the problems of navigation and mapping for autonomous mobile robots. He previously led a DARPA Urban Challenge team and is now on sabbatical working with Toyota. Dr. Leonard gave us a more practical and realistic understanding of the multitude of challenges to implementing fully autonomous vehicles than I am used to hearing at conferences. Tasks such as turning left onto a busy street, negotiating right-of-way through



driver-to-driver eye contact, and following the instructions of a police officer (instead of a traffic signal) on the street are relatively simple tasks for humans, but major challenges for autonomous vehicles. He believes we are still two to three decades away from having widely available autonomous vehicles.

Did I mention that the Illinois Section won the ITE International Section Communications Award? This is a major achievement for the Section, including Public Affairs Director Monica Shei, former ITEms Editor Ashley Hochstatter, and Operations Director Katelyn Bleach. If you haven't already liked our <u>Facebook</u> page or followed

us on <u>Twitter</u>, it's a great way to stay in touch with the Section's current events. I particularly made an effort to tweet frequently from the conference in Toronto.

Next year, the ITE International and Midwest/Great Lakes District Annual Meeting and Exhibit will be held jointly in Minneapolis on August 20-23. Submit those requests to attend to your managers now so you don't miss out!

Keep an eye out for e-mails about our annual elections and the Annual Banquet, at which the new officers will be initiated.

ITE Webinar: Street Space - Not Just for Moving Cars

Illinois Section of ITE hosted a snack and learn for the webinar titled "Street Space - Not Just for Moving Cars" on September 26th at the Chicago Department of Transportation. The webinar featured three guest speakers: Daniel Ashworth from Alta Planning + Design, Matt Lewis from Simple City Design and Larry Marcus on behalf of NACTO. The webinar covered various examples of cities across the United States recreating their streetspaces into more walkable livable spaces bringing communities together.

In Memphis, a skewed intersection was realigned and wide 60-70 ft. right of ways were reconfigured to include dedicated

bike lanes, bump

outs and a large hanging art piece for the intersection focal point as shown in Figure 1. In San Marcos, local transportation officials and volunteers completely transformed a downtown roadway cross-section in chalk for a weekend trial period. The pilot project was low cost and very successful in demonstrating to the community how beneficial bike lanes and people spaces can be in reviving public spaces. Before and after photos of this project can be seen in Figure 2.

On a broader scale, the third speaker, Larry Marcus, placed emphasis on managing curb space to prioritize bicyclists and transit by providing them with the space necessary to travel safely and efficiently even if this means removing or relocating parking. Overall the webinar focused on relaying the message that alternative modes should be viewed as a priority and hierarchically automobiles come last in these urban environments. ITE Illinois section technical group would like to thank all of the attendees for participating and the Chicago Department of Transportation for being such a gracious host for this event.




