PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE



November Luncheon: DuPage County Traffic Management Center

The November Luncheon took place on November 14th at Maggiano's Little Italy of Naperville with the topic of the DuPage County Traffic Management Center. AECOM was the event sponsor and had the privilege of introducing the two speakers:

Bill Eidson, PE, PTOE, PTP, RSP - A Traffic Engineer at DuPage County Division of Transportation where he oversees the county's traffic and permits teams. Bill has worked for 18 years as a traffic engineer with a variety of experience between government and consulting roles. He currently is responsible for approximately 345 traffic signals and for permits, signage, and traffic operations.

Andy Hynes, **PE**, **PTOE** - Deputy City Engineer with the City of Naperville. Andy and his team are responsible for the implementation of the City's capital improvement program, street maintenance program, development review, and operation of nearly 100 signalized intersections.



Bill and Andy spoke on the current partnership between DuPage County and the City of Naperville as it relates to the implementation of combining traffic management. Both spoke on how each separate system has grown over the past few years and how the future system will include a staged build out of bringing additional signals throughout DuPage County and the City of Naperville online. This partnership hopes to increase collaboration to ultimately improve coordination between the two systems.

Bill provided the audience with a brief demonstration of the capabilities of the system and how both DuPage County and the City of Naperville will have capabilities to monitor and observe traffic operations, make adjustments to signal timings, view live camera feeds, and monitor roadway conditions.

Legislative Corner

Chicago Mayor Lightfoot is proposing a \$40M tax hike on solo Uber, Lyft rides in downtown Chicago in an effort to reduce congestion and increase transit ridership. The new tax would increase tax on private rides and shared rides during peak hours to and from downtown. However, total tax on shared rights in neighborhoods would be reduced.

Illinois Governor Jay Pritzker and the <u>Illinois Department of Transportation</u> (<u>IDOT</u>) have released the <u>Multi-Year Plan</u>. This plan dedicates \$23.5 billion to infrastructure projects throughout the state: \$19.4 billion to state roads and bridges and \$4.1 billion to local infrastructure projects over the next 6 years.




